Mass Readings Change for Scrutiny

As we come closer to the Easter Triduum, the Catechumens who are in The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) are enrolled into the Rite of Election on the first Sunday of Lent. Then the celebration of the first, second, and third scrutiny occurs on the third, fourth and fifth Sundays of Lent respectively. When the scrutiny is celebrated, the readings for the Sunday mass where the scrutiny is celebrated come from the Cycle A Readings. So for the Sundays of March 7, 14, 21, 2010, at the 10:00 a.m. mass, our readings will be from Cycle A and not from Cycle C. At all other masses during these weekends, the readings will be from Cycle C. We are happy Ms. Dorothy Henry is a catechumen and will be received into the church at the Easter Vigil.

Way of the Cross

The Way of the Cross is celebrated at St. Landry Catholic Church on Fridays of Lent (except Good Friday) at 6:00 p.m. Following the Way of the Cross is a short period of Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament and Benediction. We use for the Way of the Cross, the version composed by St. Alphonsus Liguori.

Background of Way of the Cross: It is called Via Crucis (or Via Dolorosa) in Latin. In the early centuries the common starting point was the Antonia Fortress and the Praetorium near the northwest corner of the second Temple. Through the decades various routes led to Golgotha, the place of the Skull. Eventually a traditional path developed, although it is not until the middle of the fifteenth century into the writings of an English pilgrim, William Wey, that there is a description that somewhat matches what could be described as the traditional Way of the Cross today. In Jerusalem, only nine of the typical Stations exist on the way. The others are inside the Church of the Holy Sepulcher.

Over the years various meditations have been written for the Via Crucis, one of the more popular classic ones by St. Alphonsus Liguori. In recent years Pope John-Paul II and Pope Benedict XVI have sought to focus more on the scriptural roots of the events of Christ's final hours. Consequently, a new ordering of the Via Crucis with newly written meditations is celebrated in Rome at the Coliseum each Good Friday. Forming Good Stewards

"Master, it is good that we are here. Let us make three tents, one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah."

Luke 9:28b—36

Tradition holds that the Transfiguration occurred on Mount Tabor just after Jesus predicted his suffering and death, and then explained the conditions of discipleship. When Peter observed Jesus change in appearance and conversing with Moses, the Great Law Giver, and Elijah, the Great Prophet, he was frightened, but then felt privileged and secure. He proposed to make three tents or dwellings. It is possible Peter wanted to keep Jesus safe. OR he may have realized that disciples of Jesus risked the same fate and he wanted to avoid the consequences of being a disciple of Jesus. That is particularly true when we feel called to be good stewards of God's world by fully sharing our time, our abilities, and our resources. In the end, the Father leaves us no choice. He says of Jesus, This is my chosen Son, listen to Him."

As I make my Lenten journey with You, send me Your Spirit, help me to give of myself, help me to turn away from sin, and help me to fast and pray, so that I may know You better and serve You better. Let me journey to share Your grace with the world.
